CHAPTER 1 THE POWER OF ONE

In November 2022, the world population reached eight billion people, and that number grows every day. As you think about reaching every person on Earth, it might feel overwhelming. It sure does to me! But what about reaching ten people? Five people? One person? As followers of Christ, we are called to see the world through God's eyes. A person is not just a number in a crowd but someone's son or daughter, brother or sister. They are deeply loved by God. Our mission is not just to reach the masses but to touch the heart of the one in front of us because, in God's kingdom, one is never just one. C.S. Lewis once wrote, [Jesus] died not for men but for each man. If each man had been the only man made, He would have done no less." I believe this is true. As the old adage goes, "If you were the only person on Earth, Jesus still would have died for you."

The predominant plan Jesus modeled for changing the world was one-on-one interactions. And the plan for reaching the world is still the same today: "If we focus on ONE, God will help us reach EveryONE." One is the smallest cardinal number but has great power. One action, one decision, or one person has the power to affect change and impact millions of people for generations to come. When a person is saved not only does heaven rejoice, but a dramatic, tangible, and powerful potential on Earth is also released.

CHAPTER 2 THE RESTLESS SHEPHERD

The three parables Jesus told as recorded in Luke chapter 2 demonstrate God's heart for the lost: the parable of the lost sheep, the parable of the lost coin, and the parable of the lost son. When the sheep wandered off, the shepherd went and found him. When the coin was lost in the house, the woman remained and searched diligently. Finally, when the son left his father and squandered his inheritance, the father waited with anticipation for his return.

The message of these stories was underscored in Jesus' final moments on Earth, as He left His disciples with a call to action that has reverberated in the hearts of believers ever since: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation."

From David Brainard to Elisabeth Elliot, history is rich with stories of individuals who shared the heart of the "restless shepherd." Still today, God's relentless passion for the lost is just as urgent as ever before. This call to action now extends to us—to you.

Not everyone is called to be a missionary, to move across the world, or to preach to the masses from a stage—but we are all called to pursue the ONE. God's heart is restless for the lost, and He is inviting us to share His passionate burden for people, especially those right in front of us: Your co-worker or classmate. The barista who makes your coffee every morning. The homeless person you see on the street corner. Your neighbor or even a family member.

CHAPTER 3 REACHING THE MULTITUDES BY REACHING ONE

In 1963, Edward Lorenz coined the term "butterfly effect," by presenting a theory that stated the flap of a butterfly's wings could set molecules in motion that would cause a hurricane on the other side of the world. Years later, the theory was proven true, and it doesn't just apply to butterflies but all matter, including people. The "butterfly effect" illustrates how one life and one action can set in motion more than we realize, making an enormous impact for generations to come.

We see this concept in Jesus' earthly ministry. Time and time again, Jesus would concentrate His complete attention on one person, engaging with that individual as if they were the only person in the world. From the demoniac in Gadara to the thief on the cross and the woman at the well, Jesus often went out of His way to focus on the one. And we know the story didn't just stop with these individuals. From these encounters, a harvest was released among many as their testimonies touched lives and drew others to Jesus. Their stories still minister to people today.

Examples of these kinds of interactions continued throughout the early church, such as Philip's ministry to one Ethiopian eunuch and Peter's ministry to Cornelius. From these encounters, a harvest was released in Africa and among the Gentiles.

I believe Jesus' plan for reaching the world is the same today. Let us follow His example by focusing on the one.

CHAPTER 5 THE WORLD IN WHICH EVERYONE MUST BE REACHED

The 21st century will be the most volatile in history. If we are going to reach everyone on Earth with the gospel of Jesus Christ, we will do so amid the drama and trauma of our time. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus predicted days of extreme volatility at the end of the age. Yet, Jesus promised, "And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come" (Matthew 24:14).

We are being tossed about in some of history's most turbulent times, but still, God's call remains. Like the prophet Isaiah, who received his call to ministry as recorded in Isaiah 6, we are called amid crisis. Isaiah did not shrink back or allow fear to restrain him but accepted the challenge and, despite the drama and trauma of his day, and even his own weaknesses, became a bearer of good news.

In Acts Chapters 1 and 2, Luke shares an account of the days following Jesus' ascension to heaven and the birth of the church. The disciples, once afraid and scattered after Jesus' crucifixion, were huddled together, praying in the upper room in Jerusalem. The world outside their door was a storm of hostility and uncertainty after Jesus' execution. Yet, these ordinary men and women waited with anticipation for Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-5).

Fast forward approximately 2,000 years, and here we are today with new drama and trauma surrounding us. The velocity and moral emptiness of our age have prepared the hearts of billions for the good news we are called to share. Everyone needs this message, and we are called to share it.

CHAPTER 6 A NEW ERA OF EVANGELISM

The Holy Spirit's work and calling in the lives of Jacob DeShazer and Mitsuo Fuchida during and after World War II serve as an example of God's grace. The call to reach people with His good news transcends every human difficulty, even war, and He has commissioned us to reach all people everywhere and to do it together.

When God spoke to me about the "new flood" that would cover the Earth, He impressed to me that there would be three water sources, one of which would be a convergence or "coming together" of spiritual movements that would bring a confluence of spiritual power. Where and when believers connect in unity, it will bring an overflow, and the power of the Holy Spirit will spiritually flood the Earth around these connection points. Movements and streams will converge in our day in new ways, and we will see a great flood of grace. Unity is powerful, and when God's people are united, they can do the impossible.

Reaching everyone will require everyone. We know how monumental the task is before us, and it can't be accomplished alone. One preacher can't reach everyone. One influencer can't reach everyone. One institution can't reach everyone. One denomination or movement can't reach everyone. And this call to reach everyone is not reserved just for full-time ministers.

The Holy Spirit empowers us all to be a part of this mission. It will take all of us working together in a united effort to reach the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ.
